

## **IMPORTANT ELECTION INFORMATION**

Thirty days prior an election - Last day to register to vote for the next election.

Saturday before an election -Requests for mailing Absentee Voter Ballots must be received at your local City Clerk's Office by 2:00 p.m.

**ELECTION DAY**-Polls are open 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

Absentee Ballots must be back in your local Clerk's office by election day.

## **IMPORTANT 2014 ELECTION DATES:**

**May 6, 2014 – Big Rapids School Election**

**August 5, 2014 – Primary Election**

**November 4, 2014 – General Election**

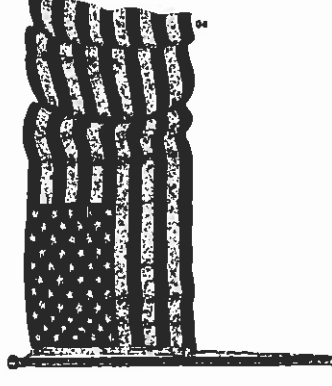

## **FACTS ABOUT VOTER REGISTRATION AND VOTING**

### **REGISTERING TO VOTE IN BIG RAPIDS**

Persons who are living in the City of Big Rapids and wish to change their voter registration to Big Rapids, which allows them to vote in any election held in the City, may do so as follows:

- Register at the Secretary of State Office. The address on your Michigan driver's license is also your voter registration address. These two addresses must agree. Therefore, if you register to vote in the City, you also have to change your driver's license address to within the City.
- Register at the Big Rapids City Clerk's Office, if living within the City limits.
- By completing and mailing a Mail-In-Voter Registration Application (\*see note on back page).
- Register through other designated agencies.

*(If your residency is in one of the area townships, you will be registered to vote in that township).*

If you register to vote in Big Rapids, your registration elsewhere will be canceled.

### **DUE DATE TO REGISTER FOR ANY ELECTION**

Persons wishing to vote in an election must be registered thirty days prior to that election.

### **QUALIFICATIONS TO REGISTER TO VOTE**

To register to vote, State Law requires you must be:

- \* A U.S. citizen.     \* A Michigan resident
- \* Age 18 by Election Day.

### **WHERE TO VOTE:**

The City of Big Rapids consists of five voting precincts. State Law requires that registered voters vote at the polling place established for the precinct in which they live and are registered. City voting precincts are as follows:

- Precinct 1: Public Safety  
435 N. Michigan
- Precinct 2 : Big Rapids City Hall  
226 N. Michigan Avenue
- Precinct 3 : MOISD Career Center  
15830 190<sup>th</sup> Ave.  
(S. Bronson Avenue)

If you live in and are registered in one of the area townships, you must report to the township polling place on Election Day to vote. Contact your Township Clerk for specific information.

### **WHAT IF YOU DO NOT WANT TO BE A REGISTERED VOTER OF BIG RAPIDS**

If you are a registered voter elsewhere (City or State), you may wish to remain registered there. Even though you may be absent from your community on Election Day, you may still vote through the mail by obtaining an Absentee Voter's Ballot. To do so, you must make a written request for an Absentee Voter's Ballot to your hometown Clerk. An Application for an Absentee Voter's Ballot may be obtained for this purpose (\*see note on back page). Once you have made the request, and your hometown Clerk has received it, your Clerk will mail you an Absentee Voter's Ballot. You must vote your Absentee Voter's Ballot and return it to your hometown Clerk by Election Day.

Remember to make your request in a sufficient amount of time before the election date to allow for the time necessary for mailing of the ballot and return of the ballot through the postal system. The last date that you may request an Absentee Voter's Ballot be mailed to you is by 2:00 p.m. on the Saturday preceding the election.
